

Arranging the Colors


Follow cutting instructions to make the two sizes of triangles (A is small and B is large).

You should have:

- 10 sets of 16 identical DARK A Triangles;
- 10 sets of 8 identical MID-TONE A Triangles;
- 10 sets of 8 identical MID-TONE B Triangles;
- 10 sets of 8 identical LIGHT A Triangles;
- 10 sets of 8 identical LIGHT B Triangles.

Note: Each of the 10 sets will make 2 identical blocks.

Make 10 sets of 2 identical blocks for a total of 20 blocks.




For each block you will use:

- 4 each LIGHT A Triangles and LIGHT B Triangles (all of the same print) chosen from the ten Fabrics 1-10
- 8 identical DARK A Triangles, chosen from the ten Fabrics 11-20
- 4 identical MID-TONE A Triangles, chosen from the ten Fabrics 21-22 & 31-38
- 4 identical MID-TONE B Triangles, chosen from the ten Fabrics 21-30


Repeat for each of the 20 blocks.

Piecing the Blocks


1. Sew a MID-TONE B triangle and a LIGHT B triangle together exactly as shown. Press toward the MID-TONE B triangle. Make four units.




2. Sew a DARK A triangle and a LIGHT A triangle together to form a triangle-square. Repeat to make four units. Press to the light fabric.



3. Sew a MID-TONE A triangle to the top dark side of the unit from step 2 as shown. Repeat to make four units. Press toward the MID-TONE A triangle.




4. Sew a second DARK A triangle to the left side of the Step 3 unit making a large pieced triangle as shown. Press towards the triangle square. Repeat to make 4 large pieced triangles.








5. Sew the Step 1 and Step 4 units together, making a pieced square. At this point the unit should measure 6-1/2" square. Make four identical pieced squares. Press two units towards the B triangles and two units towards the A triangles.



6. Sew the four units from Step 5 together as shown to make a block. Press the joining seams open. At this point the blocks should measure 12-1/2" square. Repeat to make 2 identical blocks.



7. Repeat the process in steps 1-6 to make nine more sets of 2 identical blocks for a total of 20 blocks (all 10 sets are shown below).



Assembling the Blocks

8. Arrange the blocks in 5 rows of 4 blocks each. Matching seams and pinning, sew the blocks together in rows. Press the row seams open.


9. Matching and pinning seams, sew the rows together. Press the seams open.

Borders

10. Piece, measure and trim two inner borders the length of the quilt. Sew to the sides of the quilt. Press toward the borders.

11. Piece, measure and trim two inner borders the width of the quilt. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the borders.

12. Repeat Steps 10-11 for the outer borders.









Finishing the Quilt

13. Layer the backing wrong side up, the batting and the quilt top right side up. Baste, then quilt as desired.

14. Before binding, hand or machine baste a scant 1/4" from the edge of the quilt to hold the layers together. Prepare the binding by joining the ends with diagonal seams pressed open. Fold the binding in half and press to make a double binding. Sew to the quilt with a 3/8" seam allowance, mitering the corners.

15. Trim away the excess batting and backing, then turn the binding to the back side and stitch down with matching thread.

YOUR CHOICE	Backing 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ yds	Cut the fabric in half crosswise (selvage to selvage), then sew the two pieces together along the long edges.
