Fabric 14 Cutting Diagram

1. Cut one 5" x WOF strip. Subcut into:
(4) D rectangles
(2) A squares
2. Cut one 2-1/2" x WOF strip
Subcut into (4) C rectangles
3. Cut (7) 2-1/2" x WOF strips for the binding

Selvage

Cutting

Finished size: 67-1/2" x 67-1/2"

Pieces & sizes for cutting:

- A: 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" square
- B: 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle
- C: 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangle
- D: 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles
- E: 8-1/2" x 8-1/2" square

Fabric 1, 2, 3, 4
Cut: (2) E squares

Fabric 5
Cut: (2) A squares

Fabric 6, 12
Cut: (4) B rectangles, (8) C rectangles, (4) D rectangles

Fabric 7, 11
Cut: (2) A squares, (4) B rectangles, (4) C rectangles

Fabric 8, 9, 10, 13
Cut: (4) C rectangles, (4) D rectangles

Fabric 14 *see cutting diagram on this page
Cut in this order:

Cut 1 5" x WOF strip. Subcut into:
(2) A squares
(4) D rectangles

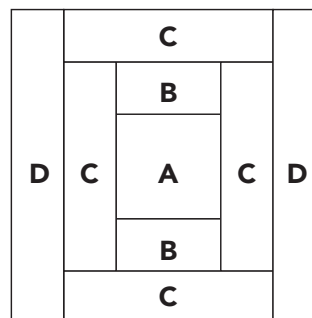
Cut: (4) C rectangles
Binding: Cut (7) 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Fabric 15
Cut: (4) C rectangles, (4) D rectangles

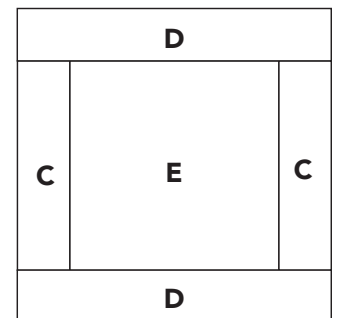
Fabric 16
Cut: (4) 10" x LOF strips for borders

RST - Right Sides Together

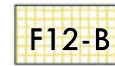
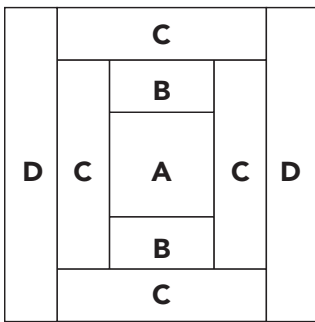


Can Animals Count? Quilt Instructions

Please read all instructions before you begin. Seam allowance is 1/4" unless otherwise stated. Fabric is abbreviated as 'F'. For example, F1 refers to Fabric 1. Press in the direction of arrows.

Gather the following pieces.

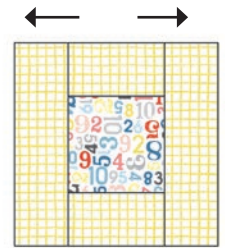
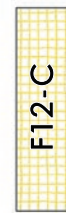
A: 2 each F5, F14, F11, F7

B: 4 each F12, F6, F7, F11

C: 4 each F12, F13, F15, F7, F14, F11.

C: 8 each of F6

D: 4 each F13, F15, F14, F6



Step 2

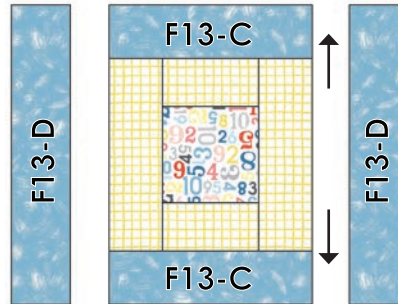
☐ 1. Sew an F12-B rectangle to the top and bottom of an F5 A square. Press.

☐ 2. Sew an F12-C rectangle to opposite sides of the step 1 unit. Press.

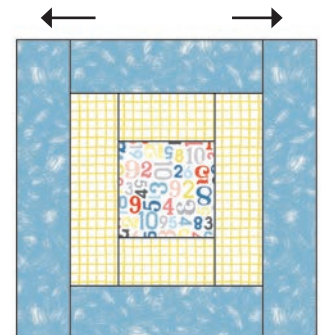
☐ 3. Sew an F13-C rectangle to the top and bottom of the step 2 unit. Press.

☐ 4. Sew an F13-D rectangle to opposite sides of the step 3 unit. Press. Make 2.

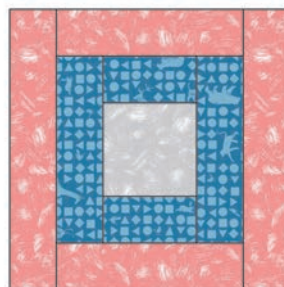
☐ 5. Repeat steps 1-4 to make the remaining Block 1 units.

Gather the following pieces.

C: 4 each F9, F10, F8, F12

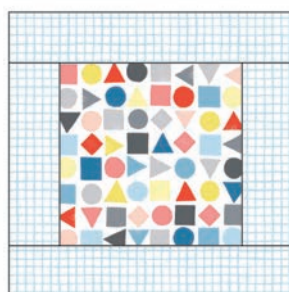
D: 4 each F9, F10, F8, F12

E: 2 each F1, F3, F2, F4

❑ 1. Sew an F9-C rectangle to the sides of an F1-E square. Press.

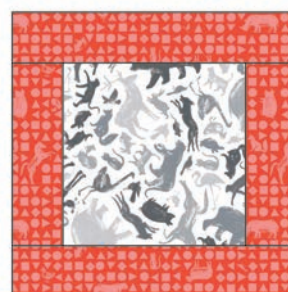
❑ 2. Sew an F9-D rectangle to the tops and bottom of the step 1 unit. Press. Make 2.

❑ 3. Repeat steps 1-2 to make remaining Block 2 units.



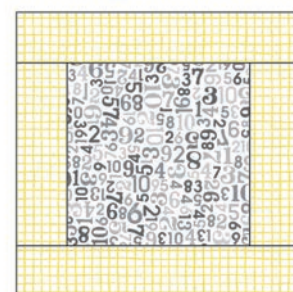

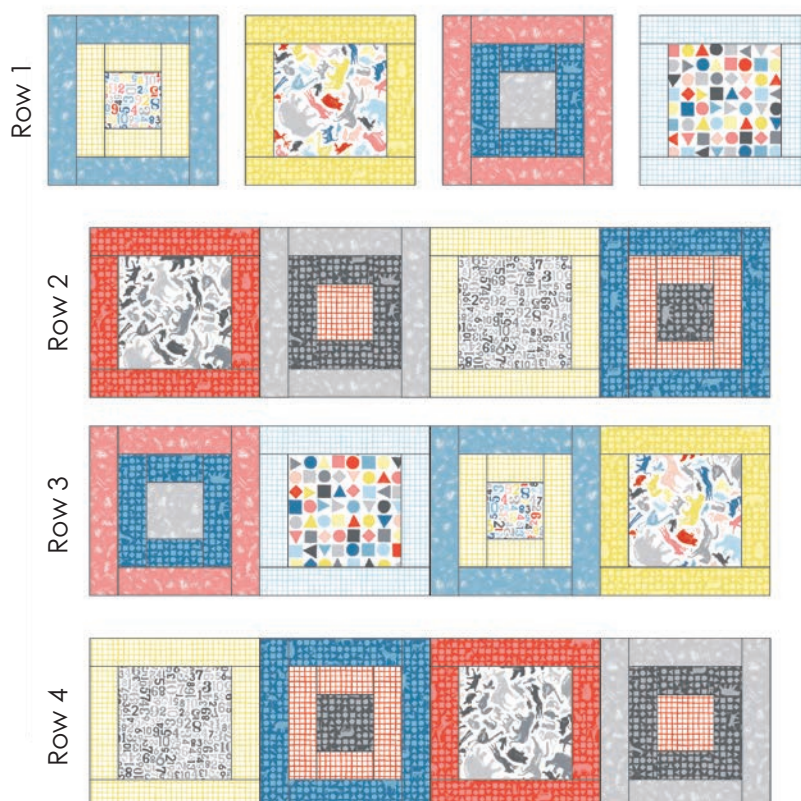
Rows

Gather the Block 1 and Block 2 units.

❑ 1. Lay the blocks out in rows as illustrated, alternating the Block 1 and Block 2 units.

❑ 2. Sew the rows together. Press to nest.

❑ 3. Sew row to row. Press in one direction.



Mitered Borders and Finishing

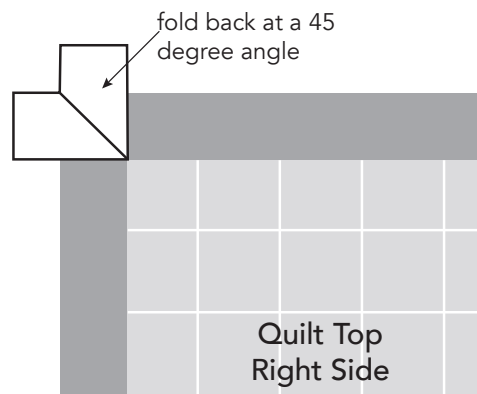
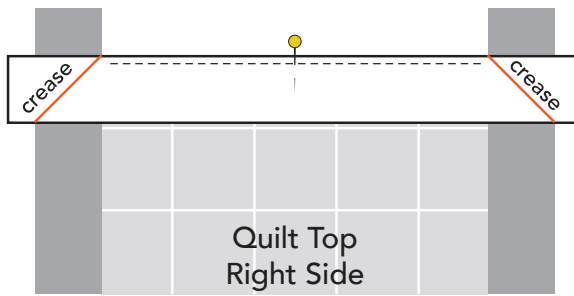
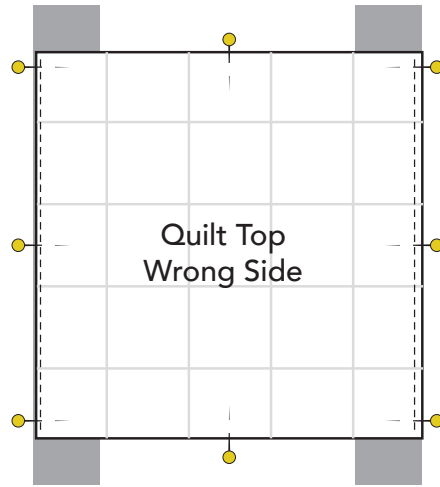
- ❑ 1. Follow instructions on page 7 for mitered borders.



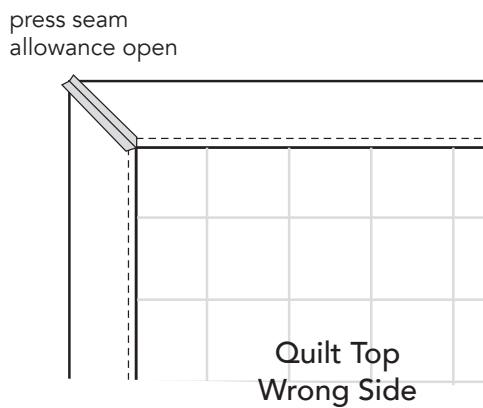
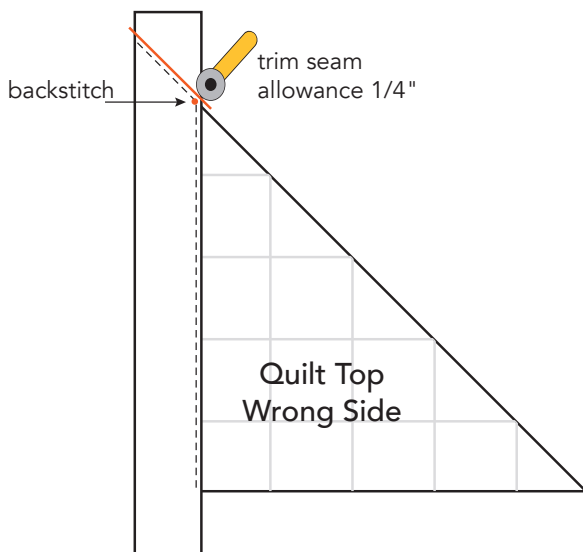
- ❑ 3. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting and quilt top (right side up). Baste layers to secure. Quilt as desired. Trim the excess backing and batting.
- ❑ 4. Sew the binding strips together into one continuous strip. Press in half length-wise. Sew the binding to the quilt top with a 3/8" seam allowance, mitering the corners. Turn the binding to the back side of the quilt and stitch down by hand with matching thread.

Mitered Borders

- ❑ 1. Mark the centers of each side of the quilt top with a pin.
- ❑ 2. Mark the centers of the border strips with a pin.
- ❑ 3. Match the centers of the border strips to the sides of the quilt and pin, RST. Sew together, starting and stopping 1/4" away from the edges of the quilt top. Backstitch to secure. Press seams toward quilt top.
- ❑ 4. Repeat to sew the top and bottom border strips to the quilt top.



- ❑ 5. Fold each border end back at a 45 degree and press, creating a crisp crease.



- ❑ 6. Fold the quilt on a diagonal, RST. Line up the raw edges of the border strips and pin in place along the crease. Stitch together on the crease, stopping at the 1/4" seam. Backstitch to secure. Double check that your corner lays flat when you open it up. Trim seam allowance to 1/4" and press open.
