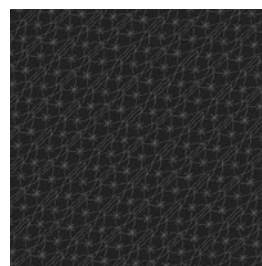

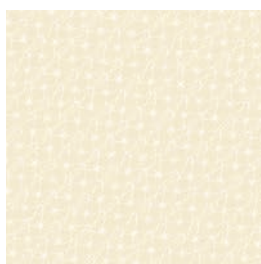

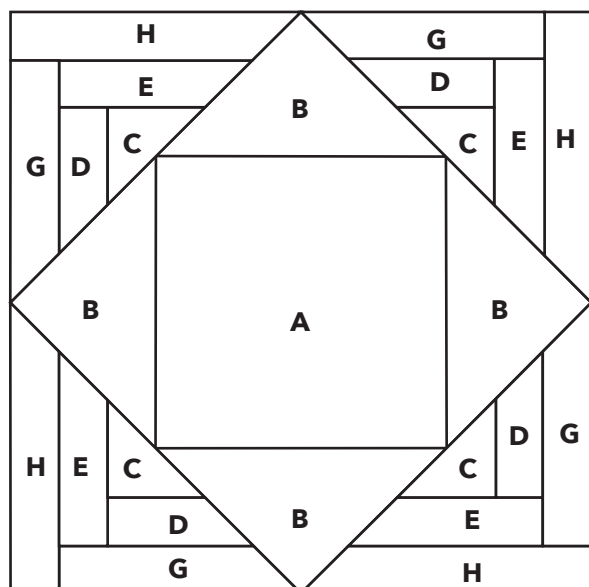

Fabric 1	D10040-E	2/3 yard *3 rows or 12 patches
Fabric 2	D10044-E	1/3 yard
Fabric 3	D10044-K	1/3 yard
Fabric 4	D10046-K	1-3/8 yards
Fabric 5	D10046-V	3/4 yards
Fabric 6	D10046-E	3/8 yard
Fabric 7	D10041-K	7/8 yard
Backing	your choice	3 yards



Block is 12-1/2" x 12-1/2"
(12" finished)

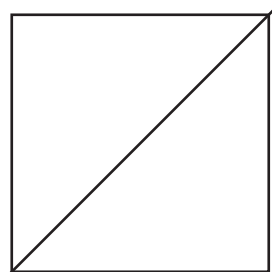

Cut once on the diagonal.

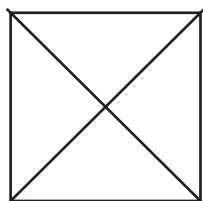

Cutting

Finished Size 46" x 58"

Fabric 1 Block Panel

A: Fussy cut (12) 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" squares

Fabrics 2 and 3

B: Cut (12) 5-1/8" squares, cut once on the diagonal (fig 1) for a total of (24) triangles in each fabric.

Fabric 4 (Black geo)

C: Cut (6) 4-1/8" squares.

Cut twice on the diagonal (fig. 2)

Cut (16) 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut into

D: (24) 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles

E: (24) 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" rectangles

G: (24) 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

H: (24) 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangles

Binding Cut (6) 2-1/4" x WOF strips

Fabric 5 (Lavender Geo)

Cut (16) 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut into

D: (24) 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles

E: (24) 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" rectangles

G: (24) 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

H: (24) 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangles

Fabric 6 (Cream Geo)

C: Cut (6) 4-1/8" squares.

Cut twice on the diagonal (fig. 2)

Inner Border Cut (5) 1-1/2" x WOF Strips

Sew short ends together into one continuous strip.

Fabric 7 (Black Large Floral)

Outer Border Cut (6) 4-1/2" x WOF strips

Sew short ends together into one continuous strip.

WOF - Width of Fabric
LOF - Length of Fabric
RST - Right Sides Together
HST - Half Square Triangle

Lavender Sachet Quilt Instructions

Please read all instructions before you begin. Seam allowance is 1/4" unless otherwise stated. Fabric is abbreviated as 'F'. For example, F1 refers to Fabric 1. Press in the direction of arrows. Use a light sizing or starch on triangles to help prevent stretching along the diagonal edges.

Block 1

Gather (6) F1-A squares and (24) each of: F2-B triangles, F5-D & E rectangles, F4-C triangles, F4-G & H rectangles.

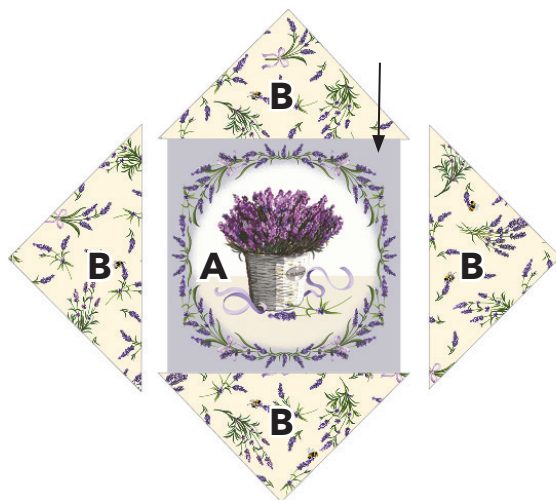
**See sewing tip on p.5*

- ❑ 1. Sew a F2-B triangle to the top and bottom of the F1-A square. Press toward A.
- ❑ 2. Sew a F2-B triangle to the sides of the Step 1 unit. Press toward A. Make 6.
- ❑ 3. Sew a F5-D rectangle to the short side of a F4-C triangle. Press toward D.
- ❑ 4. Sew a F5-E rectangle to the side of the C/D unit. Press toward E. Trim the excess even with the long side of the triangle.
- ❑ 5. Sew a F4-G rectangle to the Step 4 unit. Press toward G.
- ❑ 6. Sew a F4-H rectangle to the Step 5 unit. Press toward H. Trim the excess even with the long side of the triangle.

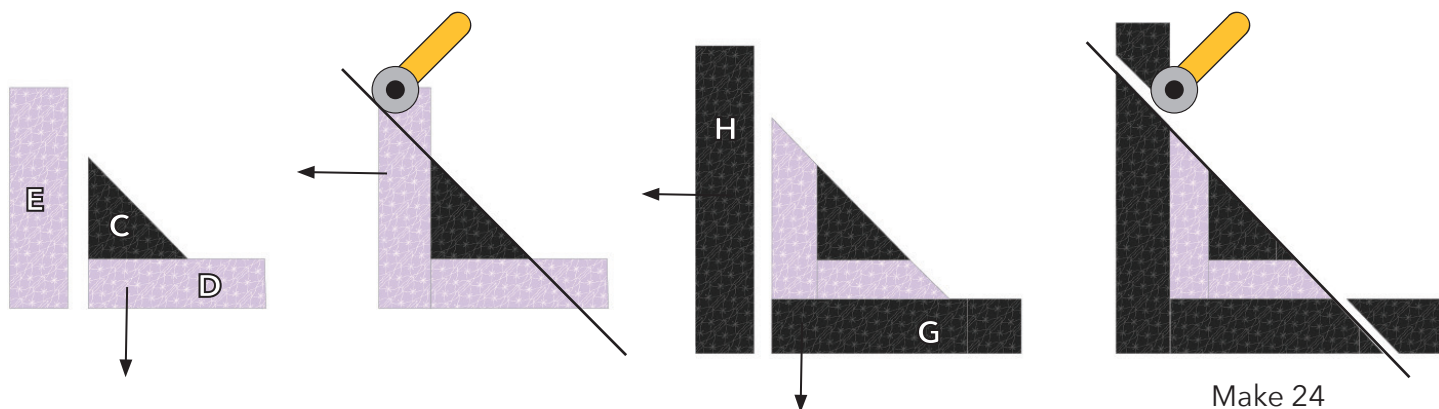
Repeat steps 3-6 to make 24 corner sections.

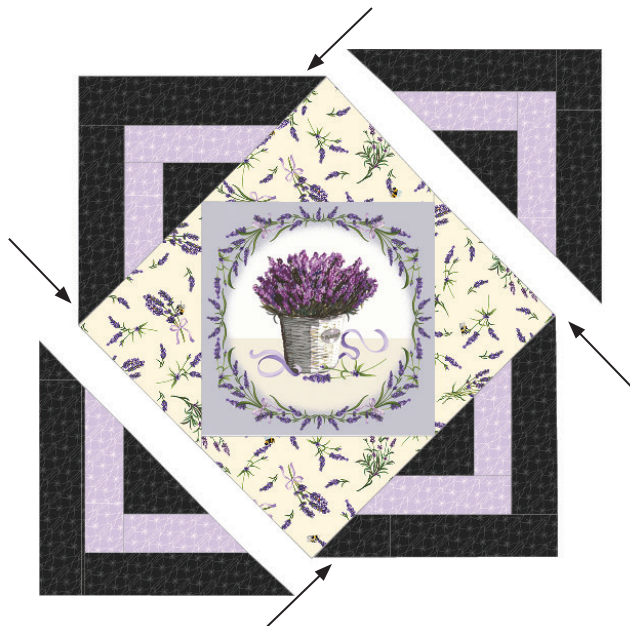

- ❑ 7. Sew the corner sections to either side of the block center. Press toward center.
- ❑ 8. Sew the corner sections to the remaining two sides of the center section. Press toward center.

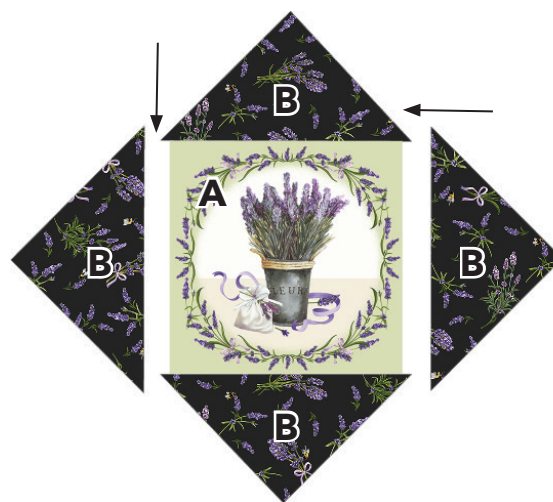
Block 1: Make 6
12-1/2" x 12-1/2"

Block 2

Gather (6) F1-A squares and (24) each of: F3-B triangles, F4-D & E rectangles, F6-C triangles, F6-G & H rectangles.

- ❑ 1. Sew a F3-B triangle to the top and bottom of the F1-A square. Press toward A.
- ❑ 2. Sew a F3-B triangle to the sides of the Step 1 unit. Press toward A. Make 6.
- ❑ 3. Sew a F4-D rectangle to the short side of a F6-C triangle. Press toward D.
- ❑ 4. Sew a F4-E rectangle to the side of the C/D unit. Press toward E. Trim the excess even with the long side of the triangle.

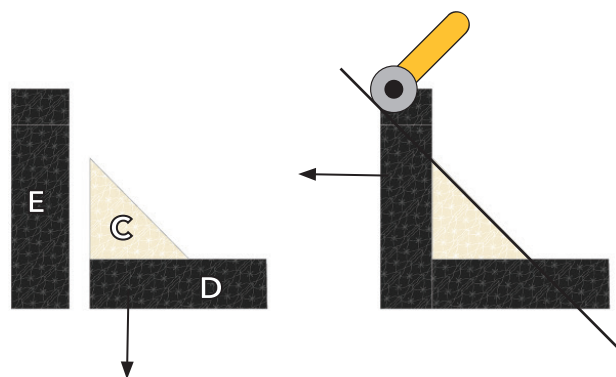

Sewing Tip - Steps 1-2

Mark the center of the blocks by gently pressing them in half horizontally and vertically to help with centering the triangles to the block sides.

Continued.

❑ 5. Sew a F5-G rectangle to the Step 4 unit. Press toward G.

❑ 6. Sew a F5-H rectangle to the Step 5 unit. Press toward H. Trim the excess even with the long side of the triangle.

Repeat steps 3-6 to make 24 corner sections.

❑ 7. Sew the corner sections to either side of the block center. Press toward center.

❑ 8. Sew the corner sections to the remaining two sides of the center section. Press toward center.

Sew the top

Follow the p.7 diagram for the next steps.

❑ 1. Lay the blocks out into rows as illustrated on p.7, alternating the blocks every other row:

Row 1: Block 1 - Block 2 - Block 1

Row 2: Block 2 - Block 1 - Block 2

Row 3: Block 1 - Block 2 - Block 1

Row 4: Block 2 - Block 1 - Block 2

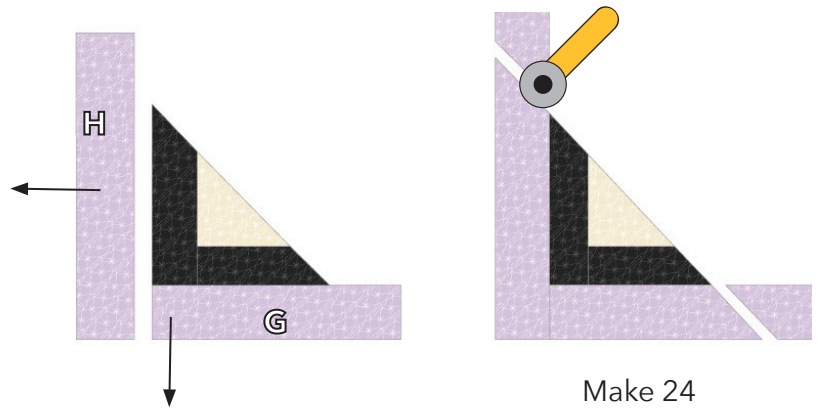
Press rows in opposite directions to nest seams.

❑ 2. Sew row to row. Press each row open. Press the entire top.

❑ 3. Measure the sides of the quilt top and trim (2) F6 inner border strips to this measurement. Pin RST from the center out. Sew the F6 inner border strips to the sides of the quilt top. Press toward borders.

❑ 4. Measure the top and bottom of the quilt top and trim (2) F6 inner border strips to this measurement. Pin RST from the center out. Sew the F6 inner border strips to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward borders.

❑ 5. Repeat steps 3-4 to attach the F7 outer borders, sewing the sides first and then the top and bottom borders.



Block 1: Make 6
12-1/2" x 12-1/2"



❑ 6. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting and quilt top (right side up). Baste layers to secure. Quilt as desired. Trim the excess backing and batting.

❑ 7. Sew the binding strips together into one continuous strip. Press in half length-wise. Sew the binding to the quilt top with a $\frac{3}{8}$ " seam allowance. Turn the binding to the back side of the quilt and stitch down by hand with matching thread.
