FABRIC		CUTTING
	Fabric 1 8433-N 2 yds	Cut (4) 5½" x LOF (Length Of Fabric) strips for outer borders
	Fabric 2 8436-B 1½ yds	Cut (9) 2½" x WOF (Width Of Fabric) strips, into: (48) 2½" x 4½" rectangles (48) 2½" squares Cut (4) 4½" x WOF strips, into: (48) Template B (follow template instructions)
	Fabric 3 8435-E 1 yd	Cut (12) 2" x WOF strips, into: (48) Template A (follow template instructions) (48) Template C (follow template instructions)
	Fabric 4 609-WT ½ yd	Cut (6) 2½" x WOF strips, into: (96) 2½" squares
	Fabric 5 8431-N 4¾ yds	Fussy Cut (4) 3½" x LOF strips, centering the narrow vine on the 1¾" marking of the ruler. Sub-cut following step 8 instructions.
	Fabric 6 8435-W ½ yd	Cut (3) 4½" x WOF strips, into: (24) 4½" squares cut once diagonally, into: (48) triangles
	Fabric 7 8434-G ¾ yd	Cut (8) 2" x WOF strips for inner border
	Fabric 8 8430-N ⅔ yd	Fussy Cut (12) 4½" squares, centering a bouquet in square. (Using a 6½" square ruler is suggested.)
	Binding 609-BB2 ⅔ yd	Cut (8) 2½" x WOF strips
	Backing Your Choice 4 yds	Tip - If you wish to make a pieced backing instead, you can sew the unused pieces of the Fabric 8 stripe together with other fabrics.

# Star Block Templates

These templates have been printed in reverse.  
Iron the templates printed-side-up to the wrong side of the fabric.


To check accuracy of your printer, this square should measure one inch. →

1" square

Trace and cut freezer paper templates along dotted line. →

Once templates are ironed to the wrong side of the fabric, add 1/4" seam allowance before making the final fabric cuts. →

Iron templates in place along edge of fabric strip.  
Add 1/4 inch seam allowance with ruler and cut.  
Rotate template every other cut to nest them, as shown below.




STAR BLOCK


1. Place one 2½" square of Fabric 4 on a 2½" x 4½" rectangle of Fabric 2, RST (Right Sides Together) as shown. Stitch diagonally from corner to corner. Fold back the square and press in direction of arrow. Trim the seam allowance on the rectangle only to ¼". Make 48.



2. Place another 2½" square of Fabric 4 on a unit from step 1, RST as shown. Stitch diagonally from corner to corner. Press and trim the seam allowance on the rectangle to ¼". Make 48.




3. Arrange and stitch together four 2½" squares of Fabric 2, four step 2 units and one fussy-cut 4½" square of Fabric 8 as shown below. Follow arrows for pressing directions of seams. Make 12 star units.




4. Refer to Star Block Templates page for cutting out freezer paper templates. Iron A and C triangles to the wrong side of the 2" strips of Fabric 3. Iron B triangles to the wrong side of the 4½" strips of Fabric 2. Use a hot temperature to make sure the freezer paper sticks. Using a ruler, add ¼" seam allowance around each shape before cutting the fabric.


5. Leave the freezer paper on the fabric to use a sewing guide. Pin an A triangle to a B triangle as shown, use the freezer paper to help match points at each end. Sew along edge of freezer paper. Remove paper from the A triangle and press in direction of arrow. Make 48.




6. Pin a C triangle to a step 5 unit as shown, using the freezer paper to help match points at each end. Sew along edge of freezer paper. Remove paper from all pieces and press in direction of arrow. Make 48.




7. Matching intersections, sew two step 6 units to the top and bottom of a step 3 star unit, then sew two more step 6 units to each side. Press each seam in the direction of the arrows. Make 12.




8. Sub-cut the 3½" vine strips at 12½" long. Cut (48) 3½" x 12½" vine rectangles.




9. Align the 45° line of rotary cutting ruler with the raw edge of step 8 vine rectangles. Trim and discard corner as shown below. Repeat process on opposite corner. Make 48 trapezoids.




10. Stitch a Fabric 6 triangle to a step 9 trapezoid as shown below to make a pieced triangle. Press open. Repeat to make 48 pieced triangles. Set aside 4 of these units for the setting corners of the quilt top.




11. Sew two step 10 pieced triangles together shown. Press open. Repeat to make 22 half square triangle units. Set aside ten of these units for side setting triangles of the quilt top.



12. Sew two half square triangles together as shown. Press open. Repeat to make 6 pieced square blocks. At this point the blocks should measure 11 $\frac{3}{4}$ " square, OR the same size as the step 7 blocks. If not, these blocks can be trimmed to size.



13. Alternate blocks in diagonal setting rows and sew together as shown below, then sew the rows together. Stitch pieced triangles to corners.



#### INNER BORDER

18. Piece two 2" strips of Fabric 7 together with diagonal seams pressed open. Repeat to make four Fabric 7 pieced borders.

19. Measure the length of the quilt top across the middle. Trim two Fabric 7 pieced borders from step 18 to match this length (apr. 63"). Stitch to the sides of the quilt. Press toward the borders.


20. Measure the width of the quilt top across the middle. Trim the two remaining Fabric 7 pieced

borders to match this width (apr. 51 $\frac{1}{2}$ "). Stitch to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the borders.

#### OUTER BORDER

21. Measure the length of the quilt top across the middle. Cut two 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips of Fabric 1 to match this length (apr. 66"). Stitch to the sides of the quilt. Press toward outer borders.

22. Measure the width of the quilt top across the middle. Cut two 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips of Fabric 1 to match this width (apr. 61 $\frac{1}{2}$ "). Stitch to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward outer borders.



#### FINISHING

23. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing. Quilt as desired.

24. Prepare the binding strips by joining with diagonal seams pressed open. Fold the binding in half, wrong sides together and press to make a double binding.

25. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, mitering the corners. Trim the excess batting and backing and turn the binding to the back side. Stitch down by hand with matching thread.
